




Causes of DALYs in 10-24 year olds, Nigeria, 2013




Health outcomes in 10-24 year olds, Nigeria, 2013



Trends in adolescent and young people's health in Nigeria






National Average does not Tell the Full Story

Actions Needed for Adolescent Health in Nigeria

Sexual & Reproductive Health

 Revise & enforce law on early marriage; strengthen comprehensive sexuality education, condom promotion, contraceptive & HIV services

Infectious Diseases


 Increase access to vaccination in childhood & adolescents, increase access to other preventive services (e.g. LLINs), promote water & sanitation, improve nutrition

Unintentional Injury

 Enforce existing legislations (eg use of helmets & seat belts, drunk driving), enact new laws (e.g. graduated licensing), improve access & quality of trauma care

Physical Disorders & NCD Risks

 Legislation & regulations (eg. taxation & regulation of fast food and tobacco company activities), parent & adolescent education, increase access to adolescent-friendly services How can the Global Financing Facility be used to improve adolescent health and wellbeing in Nigeria?


Moving Forward: Key Considerations
